| What is "nutrition insecurity"? <br> "Nutrition insecurity" is not having reliable access to 3 healthy meals a day. San Diego Hunger Coalition estimates the nutrition insecure population to be households with income below 200\% of Federal Poverty Level ( $\$ 60 \mathrm{~K} / \mathrm{year}$ for a family of 4 ).
